1	2/10/15	ALL	The description of the current order “B Hydroxybutyrate” will be changed to Beta – Hydroxybutyric Acid. The standard order sets will be updated to reflect the new name.	This change is being made to match EMR display and billing.
2	2/12/15	ALL	A new required query has been added to the VTE Risk Assessment order: “VTE Assessment Performed, Y/N”.	This is an update required query for Meaningful Use to abstract the report.
3	2/19/15	ALL	Two new CT procedures will be available: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>· CT Abdomen wo any contrast</li> <li>· CT Pelvis w IV &amp; Oral</li> </ul>	
4	2/26/15	ALL	Two lab procedures will no longer be available to order: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• FISH Multiple Myeloma</li> <li>• HLA Typing for Narcolepsy</li> </ul>	These procedures are no longer serviceable by Quest Diagnostics.
5	2/26/15	Cardio	Rename the Cardiac Rehab Phase 1 and Cardiac Rehab Phase 2 orders with <u>Inpatient Cardiac Rehab</u> and <u>Outpatient Cardiac Rehab</u> , respectively.	Requested by St. Jude to distinguish the ordering of an inpatient and outpatient cardiac rehab service, in preparation for their new Cardiac Rehab Program.
6	2/26/15	ALL	Remove the required “Lab Test(s) to Add On” query in the <u>HIV-1 RNA, Quantitative, PCR</u> and <u>IgG Subclasses Panel</u> lab orders.	Providers reported that add-on labs are not always ordered with these two tests.
7	2/26/15	ALL	All powder/chemical entries that are not intended to be dispensed in the ambulatory setting will be removed from RXM.

8	2/26/15	ALL	A new radiology procedure <u>XR Abd Port NG/OG Placement</u> .	This order clearly communicates the need for validation of an NG/OG tube placement for the ordering provider, nursing and Radiology technicians.
9	2/26/15	ALL	There will be two new US procedures for extremity studies. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• US Extremity Ltd LT</li> <li>• US Extremity Ltd RT</li> </ul>	To specify the needed extremity and avoid duplicate or erroneous charge.

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
